Dear Colleagues,

Dick Walters asked me to send some more details about the Edward A. Dickson Emeriti Professorship that was described in our campus report. The following is an excerpt from an article from the Spring issue of *EmeriTimes*:

Edward A. Dickson served as a Regent of the University of California from 1913 to 1946, the longest tenure of any regent. He is credited with helping make the Los Angeles campus a reality. In 1955, Mr. Dickson presented the University with an endowment to support and maintain special annual professorships to be awarded to retired faculty members. It is interesting to note that Regent Dickson is the person with whom Constantine Panunzio worked to improve retiree benefits.

The award for retired faculty members is described in the gift document as follows:

“For the support and maintenance of special annual Professorships in the University of California to which shall be appointed by the President, with approval of The Regents, persons of academic rank who have been retired after service in the University of California and who shall receive such awards in addition to their retirement or pension allowances. Awards shall be made upon such conditions of service, research, or teaching as The Regents may require. Professorships so awarded shall be known as the Edward A. Dickson Emeriti Professorships.”

In 2003 the Office of the President divided the fund principal into ten separate endowments, one dedicated to each campus and delegated approval of the Dickson Emeriti Professorship to the Provost to simplify the administration of the award at each campus. The terms of the endowment payout must be used as specified by Mr. Dickson, which may include support for an annual award for one or more emeritus professor(s) for annual support for teaching, research, public service, and/or salary stipend of emeriti professors on recall. The payout available for expenditure in 2006-07 is approximately \$10,000.

UCDEA President Hess, following consultation with the UCDEA Awards and Recognition Committee, proposed to Barbara Horwitz, Vice Provost for Academic Personnel, that the Awards and Recognition Committee issue a call for proposals for the Edward A. Dickson Emeriti Professorship, that the Committee evaluate the proposals, and recommend to Vice Provost Horwitz one or more emeriti/emera for appointment to the Professorship. The proposal has been approved.

The reallocation of the Edward A. Dickson Emeriti Professorship Endowment is described in a letter to the Chancellors dated June 24, 2003 and signed by C. Judson King. The fund numbers for the endowment are as follows:

The letter and the funds should be available in the Chancellor's or Provost's office. As far as I know, the only campus that has used the funds is UC Irvine and on that campus I am told the Deans recommend the recipient to the Provost. At most campuses the funds have not been used. I have made the case at UC Davis that it is very appropriate for the Emeriti Association to issue the call for proposals for the Professorship and to make a recommendation of the individual(s) to receive the award. The Emeriti Associations can provide peer evaluation and have the interest in seeing that the funds are used. As noted above, that proposal has been approved.

Dear Steve:

As I mentioned recently, UC Office of the President has made available \$10,000 annually for the Edward A. Dickson Emeriti Professorship. These funds, which are received by each UC campus, are designated for the recall of an emeritus/a professor. The Committee on Emeriti Relations has recommended that UC Santa Cruz use this income to offer a class (or classes) to be taught by the recalled professor, and also recommended that the Professorship be rotated annually among the academic divisions, starting with the division which has the largest number of emeriti, which is Physical and Biological Sciences.

I am, therefore, writing to ask that the Division of Physical and Biological Sciences select an Edward A. Dickson Emeriti Professor for the 2007-08 academic year.

You are free to use whatever process you feel is appropriate to choose the Dickson Emeriti Professor. Although UCOP's maximum contribution to this Professorship is \$10,000, the division may make its own additional contribution to cover any costs over that amount. Also, please consult with Academic Human Resources about possible benefits and other personnel issues to be considered when recalling a retired professor.

Once you have reached an agreement with an emeritus/a professor to serve as the Dickson Professor, please send me a letter notifying me of your decision, with the following information: The name of the professor; what class or classes he or she will be teaching; the quarter(s) that this teaching will take place; and a budget detailing how much of the \$10,000 will be needed to fund the recall. My office can help with the necessary paperwork and other details.

Please be aware that if Physical and Biological Sciences has been unable to use these funds by the end of the 2007/08 academic year, this offer is withdrawn and the Professorship will be offered to the next division in the rotation.

Edward A. Dickson Emeriti Professorship Award at UCSC

On April 11, 2007, David S. Kliger, Campus Provost and Executive Vice Chancellor, announced that Harold Widom, Professor Emeritus of Mathematics, is the recipient of the 2007/08 Dickson Professorship Award, a stipend of \$10,000 to support an academic program of Widom's choosing. He will offer a graduate course, Complex Analysis, during the winter quarter.

In announcing the award, Vice Chancellor Kliger noted that Widom's "ongoing contributions to research and teaching are deeply appreciated by the Math Department and by the Division of Physical and Biological Sciences. [His] commitment to both students and to the campus, even following [his] retirement, is highly regarded among everyone The Dickson Professorship is one way of acknowledging [his] efforts, and I am glad that the recognition is coming to [him]."

Yes, the Dickson is awarded in the Fall Quarter for that Academic Year, since we had a late start, in November 2006, VPAA Galloway started the process and it is rotated through the Divisions. "Our Emeriti Association does not play a role in these awards, but on other campuses they do. Our awards rotate through the divisions rather than being an open competition: Physical and Biological Sciences; Social Sciences; Humanities; Arts; Engineering."

The order was established in 2006 (I think--it was while I chaired CER) on the basis of the number of emeriti in each division, the division with the most first, and so on. Each division decides on its own procedures for choosing its Dickson Professor[s].

Dear Ms. Borger:

I am the UCSC EA representative to the Council of UC Emeriti Associations. I have received a query from CUCEA concerning the Dickson Professorship Award, and I hope you can help me with a clarification, please.

The two recipients of the 2010-11 Dickson awards were two emeriti from Physics and Engineering. The Dickson Award for 2011-12 is the province, I believe, of the Social Sciences Division. Am I correct, and if so, who is the honoree (or are the honorees), please?

The reason I seek clarification from you is that in an Emeriti Association report (April 2011) we stated that "Professor ... Art Pearl has been named the winner of the Distinguished Social Sciences Emeriti Faculty Award (an Edward A. Dickson Emeriti Professorship)." I am not certain that that statement is accurate.
