Madeline R. Moore died on September 5 in Oakland, Ca, surrounded by her loving family, after a long and dignified battle with illness. Madeline was a devoted mother and grandmother, a writer, feminist, and scholar.

Dr. Madeline Moore earned a PhD from [University of Texas](#), and was a professor of English Literature at UC Santa Cruz for twenty-two years where she helped to establish the Women's Studies Program in 1977. Her articles about Virginia Woolf were published in many academic journals, and her knowledge of the life and writings of Virginia Woolf was a beacon to many. During her tenure, Madeline was a visiting professor at Sussex University in England and at Ferris University in Japan, and a visiting scholar at both UC Berkeley and Mills College. Madeline was passionate about photography, movies, poetry and feminism.

Madeline is survived by her three daughters, Diane Wintriss, Suzanne Cade, and Rebecca Hummel-Moore, her sons-in-law, Vic Wintriss and Michael Krakower, and by her three grandchildren, Faye Winer, Dashiell Winer, and Chandler Cade. Private memorial services will be held in Oakland.
